I am currently reading a book ("COMBAT: A Motor Racing History" LYNDON B., William Heinemann Ltd, 1933). In the first chapter, describing the early history of the MG and Cecil Kimber's involvement, Lyndon, describing the move of the MG operation to its new site at Abingdon, states...

"...He (*Kimber*) took over a far larger works at Abindon, six miles outside Oxford, making his concern a separate entity, retaining only the letters M.G., by which his cars were known.

The letters stand empty of significance, except their tribute to Sir William Morris. Fiat is an abbreviation of Fabbrica Italiana Automobili Torino, and B.S.A. stands for the Birmingham Small Arms Company - but M.G. means simply M.G."
