
Reference Books

1. MGB WORKSHOP MANUAL (official)(either BMC or LEYLAND copy)




These books were available at the time from the dealer or bookshops. Very detailed. I would suggest they are a MUST HAVE!

Note 1. Before you purchase one, be sure that it covers the model you own.


Note 2. At all times, be aware that there are some slight variations between Aus-assembled and UK-assembled MGBs.

2. ORIGINAL MGB: Anders Ditlev Clausager, ISBN: 9781906133184




Long regarded the 'bible' for the restorer of the MGB, Clausager goes into great detail about all the iterations of the various parts of the MGB over its 18-year production life.

- 3. MGB: THE SUPERLATIVE MG: David Knowles, ISBN: 9781785009419




This 350-page book goes deeply into the history and development of the marque.

- **4.** MGB: RESTORATION MANUAL: Lindsay Porter, ISBN: 9781859606070




Porter's book is a very helpful guide for the restorer. Unfortunately, the b&w photos are sometimes a bit hard to decipher but overall the book is most helpful.
